

Our Antarctic Adventure Part 3 – The Falkland Islands


We sailed into Port Stanley on a beautiful sunny day with great views of the hills around the town. It was nice to get on shore in our own shoes rather than the boots that the ship supplied. It was really interesting to see this colourful little town and talk to the locals, all who have connections back in the UK. We were given a guided tour on which we saw some of the highlights of the outskirts of the town including memorials to Margaret Thatcher, who is much loved here, the Governors House and some of the shipwrecks that will never be cleared away as there are no means to recycle or dispose of the materials.

We then had the afternoon free to look around by ourselves. We were slightly disappointed to find only a handful of shops and pubs were open. Pre covid, they were used to having 5000 visitors a day when the big cruise ships were allowed to dock but on this particular day only the Fram visited with around 100 people. We visited the cathedral, the museum and a gin distillery where they make 2 varieties of gin. One is based on berries from plants native to the islands and the other is seaweed based. Paul bought a small bottle of the berry variety.


We saw a lot of the native wildlife in the town including Steamer Ducks, Kelp Geese, Magellanic and Blackish Oystercatchers and the Falklands Sparrow, similar to our own house sparrow but which has evolved different characteristics while adapting to the environment of the Falkland Islands.

We walked back to the ship and it set sail for the West Falkland Islands where we arrived the following morning.










Over the next 2 days we made visits to 4 separate islands in the West Falklands where we went on some quite long hikes. The first of these was to Carcass Island (which deserves a better name) where we were met by Turkey Vultures and Striated Caracara birds. We had a 9 km hike across the island to a Magellanic penguin colony on a beautiful sandy beach that could easily rival those in the Caribbean. In the afternoon we visited nearby Saunders Island where the island owner met us from the zodiacs, was very friendly and helped us find the elusive Rockhopper penguins who were not where the ornithologist thought they would be. We first had a long uphill walk to the Black Browed Albatross colony high in the cliffs and also saw sheep and Gentoo penguins in the same field. On the way down we were directed along another beautiful sandy beach to the Rockhoppers. Which we found up on the cliffs looking down at us. We watched them, in amazement, hopping up and down the cliffs as they made their way to and from the sea.



On our final day we first visited Westpoint Island where we hiked to an Albatross nesting colony and got very close to them as they weren't in the slightest bit afraid of us. On the way back we were invited to tour the owners grounds where they have a large vegetable garden and are a major supplier to all the Falkland islands and passing cruise ships. As we were leaving we saw the Fram's chef buying from them and taking his purchases back to the zodiac in a wheelbarrow. Our last visit was to New Island, the most westerly island in the archipelago where we hiked across the island and relaxed on the cliff edge watching albatross and rockhopper penguin colonies. On our return to the Fram we set sail for the 2 day trip towards South America and the Magellan strait en route to Puenta Arenas.

After disembarking the Fram, we were taken on a surprise tour of Puenta Arenas, one of the windiest cities in the world and where they have barriers all over the town for citizens to hold on to while trying to move about in the strongest winds. It was a very pleasant city with many historical buildings. We then flew back to Santiago for a 1 night stay before flying back home.





The next chapter of the Torque. I wish Graham all the very best, it is time for a fresh start. Keep those articles coming in, Graham needs your support and I certainly will be.


