I Some bedtime reading.. The A, B and C of Sports Cars

You CAN drive anywhere in the world and you'll always find somebody who has heard of the MG sports car. In America and Britain in particular, the name is synonymous with everything that spells sports car. Enthusiastic motorists have argued about the definition of a sports car since they were first introduced, but most agree that it ought to be open, possess really competitive performance, and have roadholding that enables it to be driven far faster than normal cars and in complete safety. Ideally it should be a dual-purpose machine that can be driven to work during the week and used in all manner of events at weekends. It should need a minimum of maintenance and be economic. Above all it must be symbolic of a fun-loving image that extends even to everyday driving.

From the time that Morris Garages made special-bodied Bullnoses in 1922, MGs have been sports cars, and their most popular have been the MGA and MGB. Indeed, the MGB is readily acknowledged as the most popular sports car made by any manufacturer in the world. Manufacturers, such as Ford with the Mustang and General Motors with the Chevrolet Corvette, have produced more, and their cars have a sporty image. But they haven't been sports cars in the mould made famous by MG, Triumph, Jaguar, Healey and Porsche.

The MGA of 1955 was an instant best-seller and at once became the most successful machine to have been built at Abingdon, the world's biggest sports car factory. The MGB that followed was even more successful and passed the half million mark. It was in production for so many years (since 1962, in fact) that it acquired the enviable reputation of being a ready-made antique, a status previously achieved only by the Model T Ford, the Volkswagen Beetle and all Morgans.

The MGC of 1967 was Abingdon's white elephant; its designers were forced to compromise with an unsuitable engine that was so heavy that it ruined the roadholding that had been the hallmark of every MG before it, especially the MGA and MGB. Such was the lack of demand that only 9000 were made before they ceased production in 1969. Today the MGC has become a cult car, such is its relative rarity, and because of its good qualities. If you could live with the bad qualities, the good ones, such as a high top speed and seemingly effortless cruising, were great. The other variation on the MGA, B and C theme is the MGB V8, of which even fewer were made. It was a much better car than the MGC, a road burner in the traditions of Abingdon, but it was crippled by economic recession and already the few examples made between 1973 and 1976 are be-

ing keenly sought out by enthusiastic collectors.



Black Country Living Museum is an award-winning open air museum that tells the story of one of the very first industrialised landscapes in Britain.


